July, 1889; educ. King Edward's Middle School, Norwich; was a Farmer, at Tunstead, Norwich; enlisted in the Bedfordshire Regt. 20 June, 1916; served with the Expeditionary Force in France and Flanders from 23 Oct., and was killed in action at Miraumont 16 March, 1917. Buried where he fell; *unm.*

GIBBS, WALTER EDWARD, Private, No. 69389, 2/9th (Service) Battn. The Royal Fusiliers (City of London Regt.), *s.* of the late Alfred George Gibbs, by his wife, Annie Mary (Church Farm, Guestwick), dau. of the late Robert Seaman, of Oulton; and brother to Private Percival Seaman Gibbs (*q.v.*); *b.* Guestwick, co. Norfolk, 11 Dec. 1899; educ. Norwich High School; was a Farmer; enlisted in the Royal Fusiliers 11 May, 1917; served with the Expeditionary Force in France and Flanders from 29 Dec., and was killed in action 27 March, 1918. Buried where he fell; *unm.*

GIBSON, ALEXANDER, M.M., Corpl., No. 620392, B Battery, Royal Field Artillery, *s.* of Charles Gibson, of Aigas, Beauly, by his wife, Margaret, dau. of John McLean, of Oldtown of Aigas; *b.* Aigas, Beauly, co. Inverness, 13 Sept. 1890; educ. Teanassie Public School; was employed as a Ploughman with J. D. Fletcher, of Rosehaugh; enlisted in the B. H. A. in Nov. 1915, but transferred to the



the Expeditionary Force in France and Flanders from 1915, and was killed in action at Passchendaele 31 July, 1917. Buried where he fell; *unm.*

GIBBS, PERCIVAL SEAMAN, Private, No. 29987, 7th (Service) Battn. The Bedfordshire Regt., *s.* of the late Alfred George Gibbs, by his wife, Annie Mary (Church Farm, Guestwick), dau. of the late Robert Seaman of Oulton; and brother to Private Walter Edward Gibbs (*q.v.*); *b.* Foulsham, co. Norfolk, 6
