(T.F.), *s.* of William Henry Giles, of 61, Algernon Road, Lewisham, S.E., Stationer's Assistant, by his wife, Annie, dau. of John Quinten Fordham; and brother to Staff Sergt. S. G. Giles (*q.v.*); *b.* Clerkenwell, E.C., 20 Feb. 1892; educ. St. Stephen's School, Lewisham, S.E.; was a Clerk; joined the London Regt. 2 Sept. 1914; served with the Expeditionary Force in France and Flanders from 9 March, 1915; was awarded the Military Medal with bar after the Battle of the Somme, for conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty, and died at No. 15 Casualty Clearing Station 5 Dec. 1917, from wounds received in action at Cambrai. Buried in Achiet-le-Grand Communal Cemetery Extension, north-west of Bapaume. His Company Commander wrote: "He acted as Coy. Sergt.-Major of my company for over 12 months, so that I know something of his sterling qualities. No words of mine can in the slightest

St. Stephen's Schools, Lewisham, S.E. ; was a Clerk ; joined the London Regt. 4 Sept. 1914 ; served with the Expeditionary Force in France and Flanders from June, 1916 ; proceeded to Salonika the following Nov., and subsequently to Egypt ; served there and in Palestine from 1 Jan. 1917, and was killed in action in Palestine 30 April, 1918. Buried where he fell. His Commanding Officer wrote : " Your son, who was my Platoon Sergt., was one of the most painstaking and persevering men I have ever met. The short while he was with me he worked like a Trojan to make his platoon one of the best, and in action he rallied the men around us at a very critical moment. He was as
