

Expeditionary Force in France and Flanders from June, 1917, and was killed in action at Arras 6 May, 1918, by the explosion of a shell. Buried at Faubourg d'Amiens, Arras; *unm.*

GILYARD, ERNEST WILLIAM, Private, No. 28688, 2/5th (Territorial) Battn. The Prince of Wales's Own (West Yorkshire Regt.), only *s.* of Arthur Gilyard, of Parkinson's Chambers, Bradford, Chartered Accountant, by his wife, Annie Elizabeth, dau. of William Wright; *b.* Bradford, co. York, 25 Dec. 1890; educ. Bradford Grammar School; was a member of the firm of A. Gilyard & Son, Chartered Accountants, Bradford; joined the West Yorkshire Regt. 29 May, 1916; served with the Expeditionary Force in France from 26 Sept. following, and was killed in action 22 Nov. 1917; *unm.*

GINDER, WILLIAM FRANK, Private, No. 229731, 13th (Service) Battn. The Royal Fusiliers (City of London Regt.), *yst. s.* of William Edward Ginder, of Spring Cottage, Shirley, Birmingham, by his wife, Fanny; *b.* Moseley, Birmingham, 6 Sept. 1897; educ. Yardley Secondary School, Birmingham; was a Solicitor's Clerk; joined the Army Cyclist Corps 16 Sept. 1915; transferred to the Royal Fusiliers 1 Oct. 1917, and served with the Expeditionary Force in France and Flanders from that date, and was killed in action near Bapaume 23 Aug. 1918. Buried at Behucourt, west of Bapaume; *unm.*

GISPERT, MODESTO ARTHUR, Able Seaman, No. J. 35356, R.N., *s.* of the late Arthur Gispert, by his wife, Remedio (80, Breakspears Road, Brockley, S.E.), dau. of Adolfo Puiguriguer; *b.* Brockley, co. Kent, 26 Nov. 1892; educ. St. Joseph's College, West Norwood, S.E.; was on the staff of the Crédit Lyonnais; volunteered for foreign service, and joined the R.N. 11 March, 1915; served in H.M.S. Monitor Europa, and took part in the Dardanelles campaign; served eventually in H.M. Monitor Egmont, No. 15, off the coast of Syria from 17 Jan. 1916, and was lost when that vessel was torpedoed
