

Johan Jakob Naegeli, of Zurich, Switzerland; *b.* Horsmonden, co. Kent, 14 Jan. 1885; educ. at The Heath Private School there; was an Artist in the employ of Messrs. Garratt & Atkinson, Engravers and Artists, Ealing; joined the Queen's in March, 1916; served with the Expeditionary Force in France from the following Aug.; subsequently served with the Salonika Army from Dec.; was sent to Egypt, and served with the Egyptian Expeditionary Force in Palestine from July, 1917, and was killed in action near Beersheba 31 Oct. following. Buried there; *unm.*

LAMBOURNE, HOWARD, Gunner, No. 159093, 178th Siege Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery, eldest *s.* of Frederick Lambourne, of 23, Grafton Road, Handsworth, Draper, by his wife, Jane, dau. of William Brown; *b.* Birmingham, co. Warwick, 18 April, 1889; educ. Smith Street Council School there; was a Tailor; enlisted in the Royal Garrison Artillery 8 May, 1917; served with the Expeditionary Force in France from 11 Sept., and died at No. 45 Casualty Clearing Station 6 Dec. 1917, of wounds received in action near Cambrai on the 1st. Buried in Achiet-le-Grand Communal Cemetery. He was a keen footballer, and goal-keeper for St. George's Club. He *m.* at Birmingham, 1 March, 1911, Gertrude (51, Westbourne Road, Handsworth), dau. of John Hill, and had three children: Howard Frederick, *b.* 25 June, 1912; Leslie, *b.* 26 Sept. 1913, and Mary, *b.* 20 June, 1917.

LAMMAS, ALBERT VICTOR, L.-Corpl., No. 12697, 5th (Territorial) Battn. The Buffs (East Kent Regt.), *s.* of Harry Lammas, of 2, Osborne Road, Wokingham, Gardener, by his wife, Emily, dau. of William Shorter; *b.* Hurst Twyford, co. Berks, 25 June, 1897; educ. Bearwood School, Wokingham, co. Berks; was a Grocer's Assistant; joined the Buffs 18 June, 1915; served with the Indian Expeditionary Force in Mesopotamia from 13 Aug. 1917, and died at No. 23 Stationary Hospital, Bagdad, 3 Dec. following, from dysentery contracted while on active service. Buried in North Cemetery, Bagdad; *unm.*

LAMMIMAN, HENRY, L.-Corpl., No. 1254, 10th (Service) Battn. The Lincolnshire Regt., *s.* of the late John Lammiman, by his wife, Jane, dau. of John Brader; *b.* Stainsby, co. Lincoln, 9 Sept. 1887; educ. Ashby Puerorum, and served with the Expeditionary Force in France and Flanders from Jan. 1916, and was killed in action near Langemarck 9 Oct. 1917. Buried in the cemetery at Thimbleby.
