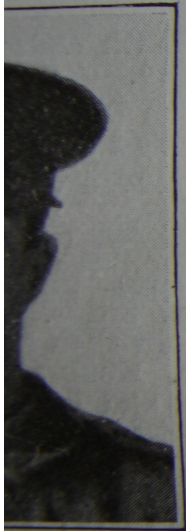

**MEREDITH, WILLIAM HENRY**, Private, No. 231405, 2nd Battn. (Royal Fusiliers) The London Regt. (T.F.), s. of William John Meredith, of 32, Hereford Street, Newport, co. Monmouth, by his wife, Edith, dau. of F. Pullen; b. Blackwood, 15 Oct. 1894; educ. Church Road School, Newport; enlisted 17 Feb. 1915; served with the Expeditionary Force in France and Flanders, and died at No. 49 Casualty Clearing Station 21 May, 1917, of wounds received in action. Buried in Achiet-le-Grand Communal Cemetery; *unm.*
