SANDYS, HENRY JOHN, Bombardier, Royal Garrison Artillery; *b.* Portsmouth, co. Hants; educ. there; enlisted; served with the Expeditionary Force in France and Flanders, and was killed in action 13 April, 1917; *unm.*

SANDYS, MERVYN KEATS, Capt., 2nd Battn. (84th Foot) The York and Lancaster Regt., yr. twin *s.* of the late Lieut.-Col. Edwin Dee Sandys, 58th Northamptonshire Regt.; served with the Expeditionary Force in France and Flanders, and was killed in action 22 Oct. 1914.

SANGAR, WALTER AUGUSTINE, L.-Corpl., No. 19584, 26th (Bankers') Battn. The Royal Fusiliers (City of London Regt.), *s.* of the Rev. James Mortimer Sangar, B.A., of Elworthy Rectory, Taunton, co. Somerset, by his wife, Harriet Alice, dau. of the late Thomas Vickery, of Southsea; *b.* Abergavenny, co. Monmouth, 25 April, 1878; educ. at Tetbury, co. Gloucester; was a Chief Cashier with Messrs. J. Howell & Co., St. Paul's Churchyard, E.C.; enlisted 18 Oct. 1915; served with the Expeditionary Force in France and Flanders from May, 1916, and died at Bailleul 2 Oct. 1917, from wounds received in action at the Menin Road battle on the 21st of the previous month. He *m.* at St. Mark's Church, Forest Gate, London, E., 14 April, 1906, Constance, dau. of Edgar Bradnam, of Forest Gate, E.

SARGANT, WILLIAM EDWIN, Private, 16th (Service) Battn. (Cardiff City) The Welsh Regt., *s.* of Edwin Sargant, of 10, Daniel Street, Cardiff; *b.* Cardiff, co. Glamorgan, in 1894; educ. Crewys Road Council School there; was a Fish-
