

DIED OF WOUNDS.

TWEDDLE, Pte. Douglas S., Manchester Regt., second son of Mr. and Mrs. Jas. Tweddle, 6, Whitton Terrace, Kendal, is reported in a letter to his parents from the chaplain of a Clearing Station in France to have died of wounds there on May 27th. He joined the forces in December, 1916, and went out to France in February. Previous to enlisting he worked at the engine sheds at Oxenholme for the L. and N.-W. Railway Company. He was 26 years of age and married. A younger brother was killed in action at the Dardanelles in August, 1915.
